Val Quentin landfill is accessible to residents who wish to dispose of natural material such as lake weeds, grass clippings or tree branches. The key is available by contact Mayor Bob Lehman. This year the landfill will be closed effective November 1, 2017 and will re-open on May 1, 2018.

Policy

Unless otherwise indicated, with signage, by the property owner, the windrows will be cleared of snow on all driveways on a regular basis coinciding with the snow plowing the road. Windrow removal service will be provided only when the windrow is an accumulated height of 6 inches or greater. No windrow removal service will be provided to residents who push snow from their driveways into the windrow for removal by the Village. The intent of the windrow removal service is to knock down the windrow and allow for vehicle passage. It is not the intent of the program to provide full clearing and cleaning of the entire width of a driveway, from edge to edge. Approximately 1-2" of snow will be left to avoid damage to driveway entrances.

Procedure

Windrows will only be removed from the edge of the roadway inwards to a maximum of 4 feet and a maximum length of 20 feet. Property owners with rear entrances will have to post signage indicating that you want the driveway entrance cleared. Under no circumstance will the plow operator enter private property to clear windrows.

Lift Station Upgrade

As you may have noticed we are having work done on the sewer line lift stations. We are rebuilding the lift stations. Work is currently being done on the two in Val Quentin, one in Alberta Beach and one in Sunset Point. Two lift stations are now complete. The remainder of the work is scheduled to be complete this fall.
