This is the only way that emergency personnel such as fire, ambulance or police can quickly identify your property in case of emergency. #### Waste Collection Services

Waste collection services are provided in the Summer Village and collections are every Monday. Please place cans at the roadside or the front of your property by 7:00 am for collection.

All waste must be bagged and placed securely in a lidded waste receptacle to prevent animal access.

Create your own <u>72-hour emergency kit</u>, so you have everything necessary to help you and your family until emergency responders can reach you. If you have time to safely retrieve them, you should also consider other items to take if you evacuate (e.g. family heirlooms, photos, jewelry, computer, phone chargers). You and your family can create a list of items that you really do not want to lose or cannot replace. The list should be taped to the top of your 72 hour kit container, or placed inside it, so you'll find it easily in an emergency. Be prepared, please, for the sake of both you and your family

**Fire Insurance** - Please read your fire insurance policy very carefully. Some insurance companies limit payments for fire costs (cost to put out the fire, cost for backup and time spent fighting the fire) to amounts below the costs incurred to fight a fire, in which case the homeowner is responsible for the balance. Make sure your policy states that you are covered completely for these fire costs.

**Piers & Boat Lifts** - ALL boat lifts, pier sections, pier stands and stored boats must be off the Parkways by May 31 annually, in order to facilitate lawn mowing and clean-up. Boat Tags are required to be hung on the wheel of the boat lift. These tags include an identification to confirm ownership. Tags can be obtained by contacting Bob Lehman at 780 924 2137. There is a \$10.00. registration fee. Boat lifts without tags, may be towed away, due to lack of identification.
