Project Background

Lac Ste. Anne County, the Village of Alberta Beach, and the Summer Villages of Val Quentin and Sunset Point, have recently initiated a project to develop a new Inter-Municipal Development Plan (IDP). The IDP will establish the shared vision for the future development of lands within the IDP area. The second phase of this project also includes the preparation of a Cost/Revenue Sharing Agreement between the four municipalities, as well as the preparation of Area Concept Plans for lands identified for possible future development.

The planning consulting firm, planningAlliance from Edmonton, has been retained for the preparation of the new Plans. The entire project is anticipated to be completed by June 2015.

What is an Inter-Municipal Development Plan?

An Inter-municipal Development Plan (IDP) is a statutory planning document which is prepared by neighbouring municipalities. The main purpose of an IDP is to ensure that development within two or more municipalities reflects the common interests of the all municipalities involved, and sets out a joint vision for future development and land use issues.

Project Phases and Timeline

The project will be undertaken in two parts – the Intermunicipal Development Plan (IDP), and Area Concept Plans (ACPs) – and shall include a total of 9 phases.
