Following submission of information for the Ministerial Order Revisions to for SVREMP, we are now working collaboratively with the Ministry of Public

Safety and Emergency Services. With Bill 49 and amendments to the ACT pending, as well as further changes to the Emergency Management regulations an updated "draft" bylaw will be developed to incorporate the new legislation and regulations. The revisions will aim to provide clarity around roles and responsibilities and the delegation of authorities between parties. SVREMP Annual Audit 2024 SVREMP Plan and Hazard and Risk Assessments for all participating municipalities were submitted in March to AEMA for completion of the Annual Audit. Virtual meeting is being organized with John Swist and John Carriere, AEMA Field Officers to review the outcomes of the submission. Bringing the following item forward from the March council Meeting: Janice suggested organizing a FIRESMART Community Cleanup Event during Emergency Preparedness Week or following the May long weekend. Work in collaboration with Fire Rescue International (FRI) and other Summer Villages in the Region to complete FireSmart Home Assessments.
